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

RE: FY2015-16 Budget Hearing Dates and Tentative Millage Rate

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**RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Mayor and City Council establish FY2015-16 Budget Hearing dates on Thursday, September 10<sup>th</sup> and Thursday, September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2015 as well as a "tentative" millage rate as required for the form DR420 calculation of the City's "tentative" tax levy.

**BACKGROUND**

State law prescribes rules for municipalities to follow in setting their annual tax rates. The law provides that the County Property Appraiser notify the City of the City's assessed taxable value by July 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. The City then has 35 days to advise the Property Appraiser of the upcoming budget year's tentative tax rate, as well as the date of the City's first budget hearing. This information is included on the Notice of Proposed Property Taxes (TRIM Notice) that the Property Appraiser mails to property owners each August.

To that end, during the first council meeting in July of each year we approach the Mayor and Council for the establishment of the upcoming fiscal year's tentative tax rate. Historically, the City proposes a tentative millage rate moderately higher than the prior year adopted rate, thus offering the Mayor and Council a modest cushion during the final budget proceedings. This rate can then be reduced during either of the two budget hearings. Alternatively, the tax rate can be increased at the first hearing. This, however, requires a mandatory re-notice by the county to each taxpayer at considerable expense to the City. For FY2015-16, staff is proposing the current year adopted millage rate of 7.9336 as the tentative millage rate.



## Council Report

Municipalities cannot hold hearings on the dates of County or School Board budget hearings. Miami-Dade County has officially established its budget hearing dates for September 3<sup>rd</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. The School Board will hold its second hearing on September 9<sup>th</sup>. With the preceding dates in mind, the suggested dates for North Miami's first and second budget hearings are Thursday, September 10, 2015 and Thursday, September 24, 2015, respectively, at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers.
